What are the Sustainable Development Goals?

In 2000, the Millennium Development Goals were announced. Eight goals to eradicate poverty, in all its forms, everywhere. Fifteen years later, we're in a better place, but the job isn't finished yet. World leaders have decided we need a new set of goals to get the job done. They're calling them the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and there are 17 in total.

The 17 goals focus on issues from consumption, to climate change to gender equality. Progressio welcomed the announcement of the goals in September at a global conference held in New York, but we them to be taken seriously.

In order for the goals to be successful, we need to make sure our Government delivers on the document it signs in September. Why we care about youth and development

We're incredibly passionate about young people and development, partly because a huge amount of the work we do in countries such as Zimbabawe, Malawi and the Dominican Republic is only possible due to the amazing work of young volunteers.

In Malawi, young Progressio ICS volunteers have been given a green light to make the most of their innovation and passion and it's had a huge impact on the community. Ungweru is one of Progressio's partner organisation in Mazuzu, Malawi. Ungweru has always had limited capacity to reach out to people in need of the sustainable livelihoods support they are providing due to staff numbers.

"We are small and have minimal reach," Dominic Nyirongo, Executive Director of Ungweru, said. "I am the only staff member with a degree and we only have one staff member focusing on our programmes. As such, our ability to reach communities and promote the organisation was poor."

Progressio ICS volunteers provide extra human resource to work with the community and bring innovative new ideas. The volunteers increased the reach of Ungweru through special projects which they designed and implemented in response to the community's needs. Each team was given a small amount of money by Progressio to develop a strong community-owned and sustainable project.

"Before, we didn't have the capacity or ideas to engage young people through schools," Dominic said. "With the ICS volunteers, we are working in 20 schools and delivering life-saving information and training to a much wider audience

at a key stage in their lives."

One family that have benefitted from one of the innovative programmes is Getrude Soko and her eight children. Getrude received training on how to care for and breed livestock, was given two pigs, and, as part of the community, was given 50 chicks. This project improved the financial security of some of the most vulnerable families in the community. Seminars

on improved animal husbandry and pig rearing were a huge success and have given families a chance to be more secure in their income.

"The pigs and the chicks are small at the moment, but are producing manure which we can use on the vegetable seedlings," Getrude said. "We couldn't afford to buy pig so this project will help us to make a little money and better support our children."

Before the night...

So, you've decided to organise your own 'So you think you know the answer?' quiz. Fantastic, that's the hard bit done! 'What's next?' we hear you say! Well, read on...

The best way to start planning is to decide **who you want to attend**, and from there you can think about the best day of the week, time, and location to get them along.

When choosing **the venue**, estimate how many people will roughly attend and how much space you will need. You could approach a pub, a local community centre, a church hall or even your work or school to see if they have a space you can use. You may need to compromise depending on what the venue is willing to offer.

A couple of rounds require **sound and video**. Check with the venue to see what they can supply. If it's not possible, there are alternative suggestions in this pack.

Get the word out as soon as possible to reach as many people as possible. Use our posters to advertise in your local community, school, work or interest group. See if you can advertise your event in their newsletter if they have one.

Get the most out of **social media**! Make an event on Facebook and invite your friends and family, then ask if the venue would do the same. Include the venue's Facebook ID or Twitter handle on your messages to increase coverage and keep them sweet. Please also include us (@Progressio or /ProgressioUK) so we can retweet and share!

To make the biggest impact possible, contact your **local media** and let them know what you're up to! We know this can be a little daunting, but we're here to help. Email us (supporters@progressio.org.uk) and we'll send you a guide that makes it all easy!

Our top tips:

- Book the venue as early as possible to make sure you don't miss out and have lots of time to invite people!
- Why not organise a raffle on the night to raise extra money? Check it's OK with the venue, then approach local businesses for donations.
- Think about a winning prize. Will the venue be happy to supply a prize? If they have a bar or restaurant, they may be willing to donate a voucher.

- We suggest charging £3 per person for entry to the quiz on the night. If 50 people attend, that's an amazing £150 for Progressio's work!
